- **Per the Canons of the Episcopal Church and Bylaws of All Saints Parish, Hershey, members eligible to vote in the Annual Meeting are:**

*Every adult Ordinary member of the Church for at least three (3) months preceding the day when the person may wish to vote, and who shall have been, for the period aforesaid, a communicant in good standing in the Episcopal Church<sup>1</sup> and enrolled as such in the records of the Church, shall be a voting member thereof, with the right to vote in the election of Vestry members and upon all other matters having to do with the affairs of the Church. – Article 1, Section 2*

*The quorum at a properly noticed meeting shall consist of Voting Members numbering twice the number elected Vestry members in attendance at such meeting. Vestry members in attendance shall count towards the quorum. – Article 1, Section 6*

## Election of Vestry Members

### Jeniece Regan



My spiritual journey began at age five, when I said the sinner's prayer after a sibling's death so I could one day see them again. Throughout my childhood, my family attended various non-denominational churches. I wanted traditional liturgy and deeper community. In college, I studied Christianity and the relationship between science and religion. I then did a semester of graduate work at Oxford further exploring those questions. As I grappled with a literal interpretation of the Bible and the ensuing tensions with science, I wrestled with my faith.

When I returned to the U.S., I attended church regularly, hoping for clarity on how to reconcile the literal interpretation of Bible with scientific facts. During that time, I met thoughtful atheists, which led me to question whether faith was necessary or if a personal moral code sufficed. After moving to Hershey for school, I attended a non-denominational church but realized it excluded people based on their sexual orientation, conflicting with the person I wanted to be. My faith fractured, and I stopped attending, as I was unable to reconcile my beliefs with their values.

Still, the core of my childhood faith endured. I realized that at its best, Christian faith calls us to self-giving love in service to others and God. To grow, I needed a community that emphasizes care for all. I began searching for a church and visited All Saints in 2025, first noticing it while running on Elm Street. When I entered, the liturgy, openness to questions, and commitment to welcoming all people drew me in. I still wrestle with faith but realize that increasing clarity comes by serving in community with others who seek growth. I am committed to deepening my faith through reflection and service, and serving on the vestry is one way I hope to contribute to All Saints.

I was born and raised in the Philadelphia region within the Catholic Church, but when I came out as gay, I began to fall out of faith with the church. Since meeting Ray and because of his employment as a church musician we've attended several churches, including Episcopal, Catholic, and others. **6. Annual Meeting Minutes for 2023**

Cathy Weaver moved and Betty Anne Frye seconded to accept the minutes from the 2024 Annual Meeting. The minutes from the Annual Meeting on February 25, 2024 were approved by unanimous consent.

**7. Highlights from 2024 Annual Giving Campaign**

All Saints had 8 new pledges during the 2024 Walk In Love Annual Giving Campaign. The total number of pledges decreased by 5 from 2024 resulting in a slight decrease in total amount pledged \$23,272 less than 2034.

**8. 2024 Financial Report**

The statement of activities was reviewed by Mother Anjel. The General Giving fund was 7.39% above the amount given in 2023. It was noted that the ASEC Endowment income was decreased in the statement of activities because these endowments were moved to the Episcopal Church Fund this year. In the future these incomes will be reported on the

balance sheet and not the statement of activities. The budget overage for 2024 was due primarily to the expenses associated with the water and mold remediation project in the lower level of the north transept. This was offset by a \$28,000 draw from the ASEC Endowment Fund in 2024.

## 2025 Annual Giving Campaign Report – Tell Out My Soul

Financial contributions are necessary to sustain the ministry and mission of All Saints! While we need time and talent to do the work, there are bills that cannot be paid without your generous contributions. Supporting the work of All Saints with your monetary gifts is how we participate in the Body of Christ and our shared life in community.


This is the sixth year we've had an intentional Annual Giving Campaign framing generosity in giving as a spiritual practice of love. In a year over year comparison, the 2026 Tell Out My Soul Annual Giving Campaign resulted in a **14% decrease in the number of pledges** but only a **2% drop in the total amount pledged**. We have a growing number of regular givers who do not pledge along with many new members.

The results of the Tell Out My Soul Annual Giving Campaign are as follows:


- Total Number of Pledges for 2025: 48 (8 fewer than 2024)
  - New Pledges – 7
  - Increased Commitments – 18
  - Decreased Commitments – 4
  - Same Commitments as 2024 – 19
- Total Pledged: \$213,784 (\$4,687 less than 2025)
- Average Pledge: \$4,363 (\$207 more than 2025)
- Median Pledge: \$3,000 (\$550 more than 2025)

The histograms below and on the next page show the number of households and their annual pledge amounts in increments of \$1,500. Compared to last year we see a jump in the second data point and a decrease in the first meaning that we have people who are taking steps to increase their giving as a spiritual practice. 
### 2025 Frequency Distribution Household Pledge Commitments




### 2024 Frequency Distribution Household Pledge Commitments

The General Fund giving was 2.67% above budget. Thank you to all who generously supported All Saints!

ASEC Endowment income is the 5% draw from the endowment. Last year, we transferred the accounts to the Episcopal Church Foundation and are now regularly drawing from the fund.

**51100 Grounds Maintenance** – was overbudget due to the removal of the dead trees at the head of the parking lot and the installation of river rocks to ameliorate the muddy patch next to the entrance to the parking lot.

**51200 Building Maintenance** – Our budget overage was largely due to the painting of the windows and doors of the church building, removal of the squirrels from the Ed Wing attic, repairs to the retaining walls on the handicap ramp leading to the Parish Hall, and the expenses associated with the installation of the new dishwasher in the Parish Hall. We have increased this budget line for 2026.

**53400 Supply Clergy** was higher than budgeted because of Mother Anjel's hospitalization and recovery from injuries.

**56500 – Rector's Health Insurance** is ½ of what All Saints would normally be required to pay. Since Mother Anjel's husband, Deacon Stuart, works for the Diocese, they share the costs of health insurance with us.

**57100 Lay Salaries** – this was lower than budgeted because we have only two paid section leaders in the choir and not four.

The Vestry passed the 2025 Budget at the November 2025 regular Vestry meeting. We are projecting a 10% faith budget, up from a faith budget of 4% in 2025.

The COLA rate for 2025 was 2.9% as passed by the Diocesan Convention in October 2025.

## Endowment & Finance Commission

The endowment and finance council consists of **Bev Coleman** (Chair), **Craig Hillemeier**, and **Robert Frost**. We provide oversight of the generous gifts that All Saints parishioners have given to the church. The council consolidated the All Saints Endowment Fund and a Jubilee Fund in the Episcopal Church Foundation. State Street Global Investors manage the funds. At our May meeting we recommend that a withdrawal of 5% of the value of the Endowment Fund be made. The vestry approved the withdrawal. The church used the proceeds to remove trees from the church property and make improvements to the undercroft and kitchen.

The Endowment Fund had a good 2025. The fund appreciated by 17%. In the fall we welcomed **Anne Burgess** and **Scott Wolfe** to the council. They have been learning the history of the council and the bylaws. Bev and Craig will be rotating off the council in 2026. We thank Bev and Craig for their knowledge and service.

## Report to the Parish from the Rector

*“Let the same mind be in you that was in Christ Jesus, who, though he was in the form of God, did not regard equality with God as something to be exploited, but emptied himself, taking the form of a slave, being born in human likeness. And being found in human form, he humbled himself and became obedient to the point of death – even death on a cross. Therefore, God also highly exalted him and gave him the name that is above every name, so that at the name of Jesus every knee should bend, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.”*

*Philippians 2:5-11*

In Paul’s letter to the Philippians, we find the earliest hymn of the Church – the Christ Hymn. It is a poem that tells how Jesus “emptied himself” to be “born in human likeness” in the form of a slave. This hymn paradoxically exalts the humility of Jesus and calls all of creation to bend the knee and confess “Jesus Christ is Lord.” While the hymn is well known and beautiful, we don’t always perceive how deeply subversive that declaration is.

In the world of ancient Rome, the Emperor was revered as a god incarnate. He was worshiped by the people, hymns were written extolling him, pledges of allegiance to the emperor were composed and recited in public gatherings. One of those pledges was “Caesar is Lord!” This declaration was the Imperial Roman cult’s demand to give Caesar the ultimate divine and

political authority over every aspect of Roman life. Therefore, when Christians declared “Jesus is Lord!” – that meant Caesar was not. It was a declaration of spiritual resistance to the oppressive power of Rome. It was also a criminal offense.

We are living in troubling times where Christian Nationalism has infected American churches, including mainline denominations. Our allegiances are being put to the test in ways that we’ve never experienced and calls us to self-examination. Who is Lord in our lives? Is it Jesus or something else ... or even someone else? Are we as ready as our forebearers to boldly confess “Jesus is Lord” and claim that allegiance as if our lives depend on it? Are we ready to act sacrificially to love and care for our neighbors, even if it costs us something?

When I was ordained a priest, I was instructed to “proclaim by word and deed the Gospel of Jesus Christ, and to fashion [my] life in accordance with its precepts. [I am] to love and serve the people among whom [I] work, caring alike for young and old, strong and weak, rich and poor.” These vows, and others, are an extension of the Baptismal Covenant where we are all called to embody the Gospel of Jesus Christ in word and deed. This is to proclaim, “Jesus is Lord” and to live that out in every aspect of our lives.

To be steadfast in proclaiming “Jesus is Lord (and Caesar is not)” and commit to the work of Christ among the poor, immigrant, and marginalized communities is the call of every Christian. We are to resist evil and speak out against injustice which harms our neighbors, but we must do this while centered in Christ’s love, never forgetting that those with whom we disagree are still God’s children and that Jesus calls us to love and pray for them. In this moment, Christ invites us to build a community rooted in an alternative vision of love of God and neighbor, repentance, amendment of life, and forgiveness. This is the core of the Jesus Movement. Let us continue to grow in that love of God and neighbor and reach out to others who long to know Jesus as Lord.

## Report to the Parish from the Wardens

### Senior Warden Report

All Saints began participation in the Renewal Works program for spiritual renewal in Spring of 2025. Early in the year, members of All Saints completed the Spiritual Life Inventory which allowed an assessment of the spiritual state of our parish. A group of 16 parishioners met in four separate sessions to consider this assessment and demographic data which compared us to other Christian and Episcopal churches. It was determined that, like many other churches,

most of our members were in the exploring and growing state of their spiritual journey. In a series of interactions with the parish and vestry this group decided that the best way to promote the spiritual growth of the parish would be to focus on two actions: 1) Embed the scripture in all that we do and 2) Focus on pastoring the community. This was endorsed by the Vestry and presented to the parish in several forums. It is anticipated that meaningful spiritual growth of the parish will require a long-term commitment with constant focus on these action items.

We encourage each member of All Saints to discern where and how to use their spiritual gifts in service to God and neighbor. This is what it means to “pastor the community.” There are many opportunities through the various ministries at All Saints. Each Vestry member is a liaison for a ministry area in Stewardship/Administration, Worship, Education/Formation, Evangelism and Events, Pastoral Care, and Service to Community. These liaisons can assist in connecting you with meaningful ministry that serves God and neighbor.

## Junior Warden’s Report

The Junior Warden is one of the two lay officers of the parish who is entrusted with the oversight of the buildings and grounds. Jim Johnston began this year in that role, and I want to extend my thanks to him for stepping in when Steve Sexsmith moved away. We had a brief transition during my convalescence to Sherry Eichorn; however, this was short-lived. Since October 2025, the office of Junior Warden has been vacant. We are seeking a new Junior Warden and ask you to pray with me that God will raise up a faithful leader for this role. In the meantime, these are the highlights of work that was completed in 2025 on our buildings and grounds:

- Installation of a new commercial dishwasher
- Trapping and removal of squirrels in the Ed Wing attic
- Repair of retaining wall along the ramp to the Parish Hall entrance
- Extension of gutter downspouts in the courtyard to remediate water intrusion
- Removal of dead evergreen trees and installation of river rock at entrance to parking lot
- Installation of two high efficiency heat pumps to service the rear of the nave and church offices
- Painting of all the windows, trim and doors of the church building

We hope in 2026 to install a new hand-washing sink in the kitchen to improve the efficiency and sanitation.

## Worship Commission Report

All Saints continues to offer a regular 10 am Rite II Holy Eucharist on Sundays and an 11:30 am Eucharist on Wednesdays. Each of these worship communities has its own style and integrity, offering two regular opportunities to pray and receive the Sacrament. In addition, we offer masses on the various holy days throughout the church year as well as observing the special liturgies of Ash Wednesday, Palm Sunday, and the Sacred Triduum (Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, Easter Vigil).


